Dear Fellow Vermonter:

When I was elected to the U.S. Congress as the only Independent, I promised you that I would stand up to the Big Money interests which dominate much of our political and economic life and fight for the middle class and working families of Vermont. And that's what I've done.

As Chairman of the 52-member House Progressive Caucus, I have helped lead the opposition in Congress against the radical right-wing leadership of Newt Gingrich and Dick Armey. I have fought their efforts to:

- cut \$270 billion from Medicare, causing premiums to double
- cut \$162 billion from Medicaid, leaving tens of thousands of Vermont children without adequate health care
- cut \$32 billion from Veterans' programs, abandoning those who made great sacrifices to protect America
- cut \$10 billion in student loans, making it harder for middle class families to send their kids to college
- eliminate all funding for the LIHEAP fuel assistance program, public television, and the National Endowment for the Arts
- gut successful environmental legislation which protects clean air, clean water, wildlife habitats and forests

What's even worse, after proposing these disastrous cuts, Gingrich and his friends wanted to provide \$245 billion in tax breaks, much of it going to the richest people in America and the largest corporations. THAT'S WRONG. And that's why I fought so hard against this absurd set of priorities.

We can and should move this country toward a balanced budget, but it should not be balanced on the backs of the weakest and most vulnerable people in our society.

The United States is a great country, but there is something wrong when the richest people become richer, while the middle class continues to shrink – and thousands of Vermonters have to work 60 or 70 hours a week to provide for their families.

There is something wrong when corporate CEOs, who earn 200 times what their workers make, throw American workers out on the street and take our jobs to Third World countries like China or Mexico. There is something wrong when 80 million Americans lack adequate health insurance, and hugely profitable insurance companies and HMOs deny patients the kind of health care they need.





9. He helped protect Vermont workers by leading the successful effort to raise the minimum wage.




Compare the Record

As Chairman of the 52 member House Progressive Caucus, he helped lead the effort against Speaker Newt Gingrich.	She has stated publicly that, if elected, she would vote for Mr. Gingrich as Speaker of the House.
He vigorously opposed the Republican budget which contained massive cuts in Medicare, Medicaid, education, environmental protection, and veteran's needs.	She has publicly stated that she would have supported the Republican budget.
He is a strong environmentalist, was endorsed by the Sierra Club, and has a 100% voting record for the environment from the League of Conservation Voters.	She has a zero (0%) voting record on key environmental legislation as rated by the Vermont Public Interest Research Group.
He led the effort to raise the minimum wage.	She twice voted against the minimum wage increase as a state senator.
He supported police officers all across the country and voted for the ban on certain assault weapons.	She supports repealing the ban on certain assault weapons.
